

ORDINANCE NO. 1984-21

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 32.02 OF THE VILLAGE OF ITASCA
MUNICIPAL CODE ON TRAINING REQUIREMENTS
FOR POLICE COMMISSIONERS TO RECEIVE COMPENSATION**

WHEREAS, Section 32.02 of the Village of Itasca Municipal Code outlines requirements for training and compensation of Police Commissions as follows:

Each member so appointed shall file an oath and fidelity bond, which shall be in the amount of \$1,000, the cost of which shall be paid by the Village. Each member so qualified shall be considered as an Officer of the Village. Each Commission member who obtains and maintains certification, or is in the process of obtaining certification, through the Illinois Fire and Police Commissioners Association, or their affiliates, shall receive compensation for service on the Commission in the amount of \$50 per meeting. A member shall be deemed to be in the process of obtaining certification by providing proof of attendance and completion of at least one training module at a semi-annual conference hosted by the Illinois Fire and Police Commissioners Association. Following the commencement of the certification process, if a member misses two consecutive semi-annual conferences hosted by the Illinois Fire and Police Commissioners Association, the member shall no longer be eligible to receive compensation for service on the Commission. No member, once appointed and qualified, shall be removed except for cause and in the manner provided by statute.

WHEREAS, the current ordinance provides that the Illinois Fire and Police Commissioners Association training shall be the exclusive training for the police commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities desire to allow for alternative training at the discretion of the Director/Chief of Police and Village Administrator.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Itasca, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE: The corporate authorities amend Section 32.02 by adding the following underlined language to the current ordinance:

Each member so appointed shall file an oath and fidelity bond, which shall be in the amount of \$1,000, the cost of which shall be paid by the Village. Each member so qualified shall be considered as an Officer of the Village. Each Commission member who obtains and maintains certification, or is in the process of obtaining certification, through the Illinois Fire and Police Commissioners Association, or their affiliates, shall receive compensation for service on the Commission in the amount of \$50 per meeting. A member shall be deemed to be in the process of obtaining certification by providing proof of attendance and completion of at least one training module at a semi-annual conference hosted by the Illinois Fire and Police Commissioners Association. Following the commencement of the certification process, if a member misses two consecutive semi-annual conferences hosted by the Illinois Fire and Police Commissioners Association, the member shall no longer be eligible to receive compensation for service on the Commission. No member, once appointed and qualified, shall be removed except for cause and in the manner provided by statute. In the discretion of the Director/Chief of Police and the Village

Administrator alternative training to the Illinois Fire and Police Commissioners Association may be designated as satisfying the training requirement for purposes of Commissioner compensation.


SECTION TWO: SEVERABILITY. The various provisions of this Ordinance are to be considered as severable, and if any part or portion of this Ordinance shall be held invalid by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.


SECTION THREE: REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCES. All prior Ordinances and Resolutions in conflict or inconsistent herewith are hereby expressly repealed only to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.

SECTION FOUR: EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
